Dear LGNA and BNA:

The hearing requested by Lower Greenville Neighborhood Association (LGNA) on the application for membership received by the Dallas Homeowners League from the Belmont Neighborhood Association (BNA) will be scheduled at the earliest date when the parties and the DHL Board are available. The format will be:

BNA	5 minutes to present its application
LGNA	15 minutes
BNA	15 minutes
LGNA	15 minutes
BNA	10 minutes

Questions from DHL Board will be reserved for the period prior to LGNA's final presentation, and after all presentations are concluded. Each organization may be represented by up to four speakers. Members of the print press and up to two representatives of DHL member organizations will be admitted to the hearing. Recording of any type will not be permitted. DHL reserves the right to close the hearing at any time at its sole discretion. Only speakers from LGNA and BNA will be heard. DHL member organizations may submit a maximum one page written comment, support or opposition to the BNA application for membership prior to the hearing for consideration by the DHL Board.

At the conclusion of the hearing, the representatives of both organizations and all attendees will be dismissed and the Board will go into executive session to render a decision. As with all membership applications, an affirmative vote of 2/3 of those directors present at the hearing will be required to admit Belmont NA. As President, I will communicate the decision to both parties.

The criteria adopted by the League prior to the 1986 hearing requested by the previous Belmont Neighborhood Association on Lower Greenville Neighborhood Association application and


employed in that process will be used at the current hearing. They are:

1. The focus is to be on the basis of the objection to the group's membership; the challenging party bears the burden of proof to justify rejection of the application.
2. The key criterion is the group's consonance with the League, i.e., the compatibility of its values, goals and activities with the values, goals and activities of the League.
3. The evidence at a Board hearing on a contested application should be directed toward the functions, activities and structure of the prospective member.
4. The purpose, motivation and goals of the leaders and founders of the prospective member are relevant, but only insofar as they shed light on whether or not the other criteria are satisfied.

Please provide by noon, Wednesday October 17, 2007, the dates your group will be available for a hearing during the remainder of October and first two weeks of November. DHL will attempt to schedule a hearing at a time that is identified by both groups and that will allow maximum participation by the DHL Board. If no such date is evident, DHL will set a hearing date and time with at minimum of 5 days notice to each of your groups.
